## **OLD BUSINESS**

1. Ainsley House Holiday Decorating
  - a. Commissioners decorated a room at the Ainsley House for their holiday tours. The decorating went well and photos from the public were used to decorate the tree.
2. YAC Social
  - a. Those who attended the YAC Social enjoyed the event. It was nice to meet teens from other leadership groups and hear what they were working on. During the event, YAC Attack ideas were brainstormed. This will be an event held on March 26, 2022. The commission will likely need to prepare a presentation for the event that will be discussed in the near future.
3. Study Hall
  - a. The study hall event was successful. The therapy animals that attended were a big hit. Commissioners discussed how to get higher attendance in the future. Some ideas for improvements included having less tables and chairs, providing more power cords, and inviting teachers or tutors to attend for extra help.
4. Storytime with Santa
  - a. The Storytime with Santa event was fun to assist with. Many of the commissioners enjoyed interacting with the children and thought it went over well.
5. Small Business Saturday
  - a. The small business Saturday social media posts have been successful so far. It is nice to support the community and they have been generating a lot of attention to our profile.
6. Clean Water Project
  - a. The West Valley Clean Water Authority group approved purchasing a gift card as a prize for an art contest that the commissioners would like to organize. March would be a good time to potentially host the event. This would be a virtual event that people could submit entries via an online submission form. Ideas for judging included having some art teachers from the local schools pick their top choice and also having a public voting site to have a people's choice winner as well. The subcommittee should put together a timeline and more details for the event before our next meeting.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

1. Coffee & Politics
  - a. Coffee & Politics is an annual event for the Commission to hold that gives Campbell youth the chance to talk to local politicians and school board members in a casual setting, traditionally held at a local coffee shop. Commissioners discussed if the event this year should be formatted more like last year where guests were asked a series of questions and the audience could participate or if it should be less structured like years past. Many agreed that the event would be better if held at a local coffee shop and have a more casual feel. Guests could do

a general introduction of themselves, then mingle with the public after. Subcommittee members should begin reaching out to coffee shops that would have nice spaces for the event soon. April 2<sup>nd</sup> seemed like a good date that gives the team time to plan and invite guests.

2. Tri-City Teen Day
  - a. The cities of Cupertino and Saratoga would like to host an event with our commission. The liaisons have discussed possible ideas and concluded that a fair-type event for teens would be beneficial to the community. Looking over all calendars, April 23<sup>rd</sup> was the best date for all cities. The commissioners liked this idea and discussed ideas that included inflatable games, 9 square, food trucks, performers, and a yoga corner. Performers could be school dance teams that would draw more people from our city to the event as well. The subcommittee will discuss more ideas and bring details to the next meeting.
3. Half Term Check In
  - a. The commission is now halfway through the term and wanted to check in about how things are going so far and what the plans for the second half were looking like. Commissioners thought their events so far have gone well. There has been a good balance of events led by them and others that they helped with. For the coming months there are many things on the calendar including assisting with the February Fun Run, hosting the virtual art contest, attending YAC Attack, hosting coffee & politics, co-hosting teen day, and planting a tree. Another possible event that the commissioners would like to consider hosting is the teen job fair. May 13<sup>th</sup> seemed like a possibly good day for the event. Additional ideas for this event will be discussed at the next meeting.
